New Ebola outbreak in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. The African country has declared a new Ebola epidemic in the northwest on Monday, when the one that affects the regions of North Kivu, Ituri and South Kivu, in the northeast and near the borders of Uganda, has not yet been terminated. , Rwanda and South Sudan. It takes place in the Air Congo neighborhood in Mbandaka, a city in the province of Ecuador located some 600 kilometers from the capital, Kinshasa, and connected to it by the Congo River. This area already experienced an Ebola epidemic between May and July 2018, and it resulted in 54 cases and 33 deaths. In addition, the DRC faces two other epidemics: one of measles, which has caused more than 6,000 deaths in the past year; and covid-19, with 3,200 cases and 72 deaths, according to official figures.**Chronicle of José Naranjo**

More afraid of hunger in Malawi. A survey conducted in recent weeks in Malawi has revealed that 81% of citizens are more afraid of hunger than of covid-19. Those over 55, in particular, fear it less, even though they are at greater risk than young people. In addition, 60% of respondents are concerned about the collapse of the health system and another 76% say they are afraid of social stigma in case of contracting the disease. The survey was carried out between May 7 and 28 by the Malawi Institute of Public Opinion and Research (Ipor). The country has 284 registered positives and no deaths.
